

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AGENCY'S DISCUSSION AND ANALYSIS

The Public Service Commission of South Carolina (Commission or PSC) regulates the rates and services of investor-owned public utilities in the State of South Carolina and has limited jurisdiction related to the South Carolina Public Service Authority ("Santee Cooper"). With over 100 years of service to the state of South Carolina, the PSC establishes just and reasonable standards for their rates and services.

The mission of the Public Service Commission of South Carolina is to serve the public by providing open and effective regulation and adjudication of the state's public utilities, through consistent administration of the law and regulatory process. The State Regulation of Public Utilities Review Committee serves as the joint legislative committee that oversees the operations of the Commission as a result of Act 175 of 2004 and is chaired by Senator Thomas Alexander.

For the Public Service Commission of South Carolina to carry out its mission, the Commission must be alert to and anticipate emerging issues in the industries it regulates, including federal regulatory developments. Maintaining effective communications with its stakeholders aided the Commission in achieving this goal.

Executive Summary of Achievements

Strategic Goal I: Optimize the Effectiveness of Commission Processes and Systems

- Phases V, VI, and VII of the Docket Management System Enhancement Project were completed during the year. The updates included modified Notices of Electronic Filing (NEF), added information to Docket detail pages, and increased functionality by giving users the ability to create duplicate filings to file in multiple dockets.
- The Commission continued to review its regulations pursuant to S.C. Code Ann. Section 1-23-120(J). Five hearings on Articles 3, 4, 5, 7, and 8 of Chapter 103 of the S.C. Code of Regulations were held, and two workshops were conducted by Commission Staff.

Strategic Goal II: Promote Operational Excellence & Transparency

- The Commission's fiscal year 2022-2023 ad campaign resulted in a 19% increase in traffic to PSC websites.
- The Commission produced and published 20 Public Information Notices (PINs), exceeding its goal of one dozen. Two of the PINs were advertised nationally.

Strategic Goal III: Embrace Risk Management

- A risk assessment was conducted via a survey to employees. Opportunities for improvement were noted regarding internet usage, building security, and emergency plans.
- Civilian Response to Active Shooter Events (CRASE) Training was held for Commissioners and Staff.

Strategic Goal IV: Maintain Commitment to an Engaged Adjudicatory Process

- The PSC hosted three in-house educational sessions during the year with external experts from the Regulatory Assistance Project, U.S. Department of Energy, and Lawrence Berkeley National Laboratory on Performance Based Ratemaking and Grid Resilience.
- Commissioners and Staff participated in over 760 hours of professional education.
- Annual Ethics Training was conducted in accordance with S.C. Code Ann. Section 58-3-30 (C).

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The Commission continued to improve its hearing procedures so as to provide the public with accessible, transparent, and effective regulation of public utilities and provide the public with clear information about the regulatory process and its decisions. In an effort to increase transparency and engagement with public utility consumers, the Commission continued the implementation of a more robust communications platform, including its SC Utility Consumer website, social media accounts, and advertisement campaign.

An ongoing goal of the Commission is to improve its operations through technological advances. As opportunities are identified, the Commission will investigate both costs and benefits before taking the appropriate actions.

With growing pressure for the generation of energy using alternative energy sources, the Commission must effectively regulate the electric and gas industries, safeguarding the ratepayers without unduly burdening the industries or stifling competition.

The public relies on the Commission's online systems to access information related to its operations. The Commission must budget funds to support maintenance and development of the systems.


The Commission's primary duty is to adjudicate cases involving the state's investor-owned utilities. This past fiscal year, the Commission opened 450 new dockets, including non-docketed items, held 41 hearings, issued 91 orders, and 726 directive orders. In 2021-2022, the PSC issued 366 orders and 423 directive orders. A total of 7,461 matters were posted on the Commission's Docket Management System (DMS). The Commission also held 44 Commission Business Meetings during the year.







The Commission's hearings encompass the electric, gas, telecommunications, transportation, water, and wastewater industries. There continues to be a steady number of filings and/or hearings within the electric industry due to the impact of new issues which must be addressed from a regulatory standpoint, including the SC Energy Freedom Act of 2019. Some of these issues include demand-side management and energy efficiency programs, avoided cost methodologies and calculations, and integrated resource plans. Commission Staff continued its review of Chapter 103 of S.C. Code of Regulations pursuant to S.C. Code Ann. Section 1-23-120(J). This ongoing review accounts for the continued increase in Administrative matters. **Appendix A** provides a breakdown of the types of hearings the Commission held throughout the year.




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During the fiscal year, the PSC disposed of 923 action items at the Commission's Business Meetings, and the Commission was advised of 3,972 matters. Action items are matters where the Commission makes a decision during a Commission Business Meeting. Matters of significant importance were decided throughout the fiscal year that required devotion of time and resources.

The Commission issued 153 Directives, 761 Directive Orders, and 91 Orders throughout the fiscal year. The Commission saw a significant increase and decrease to its Directive Orders and Orders, respectively, during the fiscal year. This is a direct result of Act 214 of 2022, which amended the Commission's regulatory authority of motor vehicle carriers. Notably, the Commission issued its orders within an average of 38 days between Commission Directive and Order issuance. The following charts breakdown this work product by industry.

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
The Commission continued to execute its robust digital communications program during the year to increase the transparency of the Agency's operations. This program included digital newsletters, livestreaming of Commission hearings and meetings, the use of social media, and an increased public communications plan through the Commission's SC Utility Consumer website and blog. The Commission uses the SC Utility Consumer website as a tool to increase public awareness and knowledge about the PSC's role in the community and how it serves the citizens of South Carolina. The user-friendly site educates the public on the Commission's role, services, and processes in an easily digestible format. These efforts improved the transparency of the Commission's operations.

The PSC continued its coordinated ad campaign to drive traffic to its websites and its social media content. At the start of the fiscal year, the PSC set new metrics for success, including 10,000 total followers across all Commission social media properties. Mid-year, the Commission shifted its strategy to focus on converting followers to consumer-relevant information on its websites, rather than acquiring followers on social media. This strategy resulted in increased traffic to Commission websites but resulted in a shortfall of its original goal. The following table depicts the increase in the PSC's social media followers over time.

The 2022-2023 advertisement campaign shifted the Commission's approach from a follower campaign to a conversion campaign. This means the Commission focused on driving engagement on its websites. As a result of the campaign, average monthly traffic on the PSC websites increased by 19%. Users find the Public Service Commission website in several ways, including referrals from other sources—that is, a link a user clicks on another website or social media that transfers them to <u>www.psc.sc.gov</u>. 13.49% of our website traffic comes from such referrals, of which 18.52%, or 1,685 sessions, come directly from Facebook. This only measures users who click on our advertisements to be taken to Facebook, not the total number of people who see our ad on Facebook or who follow us on the platform.

The PSC launches advertisements each month—generally between the 1st and 5th of each month, depending on creative production and Commission approval—and can see the direct impact of these advertisements based on the number of users who arrive at the PSC site as a result. The following page illustrates a depiction of referral traffic with two periods delineated: October through March, when PSC advertising was focused on gaining followers on social media (that is, conversions were measured by follower count), and April through June, when PSC advertising goals pivoted to converting Facebook followers to website users. Note that referral traffic went from 12.42% in that first period to 15.11% in the second.





During the fiscal year, the Commission continued livestreaming its Commission Business Meetings, hearings, and training sessions. Statistics for the livestream service are provided below. The livestream averaged 1,840 users per month (live and on-demand) during the year, with visitors averaging five minutes and thirty-eight seconds each visit. SCETV updated its livestream data portal during the year, which affected the accuracy of the data from December through April. Therefore, the total events data for fiscal year 2022-2023 is incomplete. The livestream traffic will continue to be tracked to further analyze its trends over time.



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During the 2022-2023 fiscal year, the Commission continued to use its eService System to serve matters and orders to parties of record in a docket. The system continues to be an effective and efficient resource for delivering matters and orders in a timely manner. The following chart and table provide a breakdown of the items served via the system by industry. The electric industry continues to be the most active. Electric matters stemming from the SC Energy Freedom Act, including avoided cost methodologies and integrated resource plans, and fuel cases are the reasons for the dominance of electric related matters and orders served via the system during the year.

Since the introduction of the eService System, the Commission has seen a significant reduction in postage costs, as well as, the benefit of streamlined processes and procedures. Over time, the chart illustrates a meaningful decline in costs. This significant cost reduction is attributable to the Commission's eService System and highlights the benefit of its use. There was an increase in postage costs during the fiscal year due to the filing of two Office of Regulatory Staff Petitions for Revocation of Certificates of Public Convenience and Necessity of Certain Motor Carriers for non-payment of decal fees and/or for failure to maintain and file evidence of insurance and for failure to file annual reports and/or gross receipts for 2022 and the filing of one Office of Regulatory Staff Petition for Revocation of Certificates of Public Convenience and Necessity of Certain Telephone Utilities for failure to file certain reports and/or failure to make certain payments. Thirty-day notices for Defendants/Respondents to respond to Petitions for Revocation of Certificates of Public Convenience and Necessity and for Complaints are addressed and mailed to Defendants/Respondents via certified mail, return receipt requested and delivery restricted to the addressee.



The Public Service Commission performs an annual exercise of developing performance measures in the areas that are critical to the successful operation of the Agency. The Agency's Strategic Plan will serve as guidance in the performance measurement development process.







Section 1-23-120(J). The Commission conducted eight workshops in FY 2021, beginning its review of Chapter 103 of the S.C. Code of Regulations. This review continued in FY 2022, where the Commission conducted six additional workshops to receive input from its stakeholders.
					The Commission continued its review in FY 2023 b filing Notices of Drafting for each of the eight Articles of Chapter 103 of the S.C. Code of Regulations. Hearings were conducted on the proposed amendments to Articles 3, 4, 5, 7, and 8 during the year.

The Commission planned and held a Renewable Energy and Emerging Energy Technologies Workshop to engage various stakeholder groups in compliance with S.C. Code Ann. Section 58-37-60. S.C. Code Ann. Section 58-37-60 gave the Public Service Commission and Office of Regulatory Staff the authority to create an integration study specifically requiring evaluation of what is required for electrical utilities to integrate increased levels of renewable energy and emerging energy technologies while maintaining economic, reliable and safe operation of the electricity grid in a manner consistent with the public interest. The workshop was held August 25-26, 2022 for stakeholders to provide input on the appropriate scope of the study. Fourteen stakeholder groups, including the balancing areas of each electrical utility, participated in the workshop.

The Commission will plan and hold a Renewable Energy and Emerging Energy Technologies Workshop to engage various stakeholder groups in compliance with S.C. Code Ann. Section 58-37-60

The Commission opened Docket No. 2023-121-E on April 7, 2023 in compliance with S.C. Code Ann. Section 58-27-265 for the purposes of identifying the regulatory challenges and opportunities associated with the electrification of the transportation sector.

Commission Directive Order No. 2022-755 established the "Technical Advisory Team" (TAT). The Order invited stakeholders from the balancing areas of each electrical utility, the SC Electric Cooperatives, Municipal Electric Utility representatives, Lockhart Power Company, Reprensentatives from renewable energy and emerging energy technology groups, Manufacturers, State Agencies, and University Representatives.

Commission Directive Order No. 2023-65 appointed twenty-one persons to the TAT, and required the Team to meet at least once between April 1, 2023 and May 15, 2023. The Team was ordered to select a Chair and Vice Chair, and to not meet again until after July 1, 2023.

The TAT provided an update to the Commission via letter on May 26, 2023, stating it had convened on May 25, 2023 and selected its Chair as Adel Nasiri, Ph.D. of the University of South Carolina, and Vice Chair as Leigh Tondini, Utility Strategy Director for Duke Energy Carolinas, LLC. The next meeting is scheduled for August 3, 2023.

S.C. Code Ann. Section 58-27-265 requires the Commission to issue a report to the Joint Committee on the Electrification of Transportation. Upon submission of the report, the Commission is required to open a docket at least every three years thereafter to study the regulatory issues related to the electrification of the transportation sector and report back to the Joint Committee and the General Assembly.

The Legal Department was down from five attorneys to three quickly and in less than two months without a reduction in work product needs – but rather a growing increase. Due to the loss of attorneys, the Legal Department has to manage resources and priorities, as well as engage in the search and interview for additional qualified legal counselors. First priorities were Orders, such as rate cases and others having a mandatory statutory deadline, and new hires. No statutory deadline was missed. The Commission was successful in obtaining two well respected practicing attorneys to join the Commission with one beginning in October 2022 and the other in January 2023 to fill existing attorney vacancies. With Fiscal Year 2023-2024, budgeted funds allow the agency additional Legal Department staff to meet the needs of the Commission and Commissioners.
